Texts & Titles of the Sermons in April

Sunday, April 7th, 2024

Second Sunday of Easter Communion Service / Quarter (Coin) Sunday "Walk in the Light" 1 John 1:1 - 2:2

This passage primarily focuses on the themes of fellowship with God, walking in the light, acknowledging sin, and the role of Jesus Christ as our advocate and atonement for sin. It highlights the need for honesty about our sins and the assurance that God forgives those who confess and repent.

Sunday, April 14th, 2024

Third Sunday of Easter
"His Great Love"
1 John 3:1-7

This passage highlights the incredible love that God has bestowed upon us by calling us His children. He emphasizes that although the world may not recognize us as children of God, our true identity is found in Him. The passage encourages believers to purify themselves and live righteous lives, reflecting the character of God. Fifth Sunday of Easter

"We Bear Fruit"

1 John 4:7-21

This passage emphasizes the importance of love in the Christian life. That love comes from God because God is love. It encourages believers to love one another because love is an essential characteristic of God's nature, and those who love are born of God and know God. The passage highlights that genuine love is sacrificial, selfless, and not based on fear but on trust in God's perfect love.

LECTIONARY BIBLE STUDY

Sunday, April 7th

Gospel: John 20:19-31 - "The Church is Born"

Think About It: Once they recognized Jesus, he again offered them peace; now they could receive it. Then he commissioned them to continue the work God had sent him to do: As God has sent me, so I send you. He "breathed" the Spirit into them to empower them to continue his work.

Sunday, April 14th

Gospel: Luke 24:36-48 - "The Fulfillment of Scripture" **Think About It:** Jesus reminded the disciples that he told them all these things while still with them. There is, therefore, a mystery about the resurrected Jesus. He appeared to them, but he was no longer "with them." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.

Sunday, April 21st

Gospel: John 10:11-8 - "The Good Shepherd Knows" **Think About It:** The flock whom the shepherd knows is not limited to Israel (or to Christians). All who hear and obey Jesus' voice, however different they may be and however much we may not like them, belong to Christ's flock. We reach out to those who are not of the flock, but who hear the voice of Jesus.

Sunday, April 28th

Gospel: John 15:1-8 - "The Relationship of Vine and Branch **Think About It:** Jesus said, "I am the vine you are the branches" (John 15:5). "I am" is a statement both of self-identity and of relationship with God, since it is a way of saying the divine name. Jesus claims for himself not only an intimate relationship with God, but also the very nature of God.

Wednesday, April 3rd
Text: Psalm 133

Summary: Psalm 133 celebrates the beauty and significance of unity among God's people. The psalmist emphasizes that unity is not only pleasant but also brings about God's commanded blessing and life everlasting. This psalm reminds us of the importance of harmony and cooperation within the community of believers, reflecting the unity of the body of Christ. Wednesday, April 10th Scripture: Psalm 4

Wednesday, April 17th Scripture: Psalm 33

It celebrates God's wisdom and righteousness, contrasting His power with the limitations of human strength and earthly rulers. Wednesday, April 24th
Scripture: Psalm 22:25-31

Summary: The passage declared God's sovereignty and faithfulness. A declaration of God's universal sovereignty, acknowledging that all nations will bow before Him, and future generations will serve Him. It is a proclamation of God's enduring faithfulness and the assurance that His kingdom will endure forever.

BOOK CLUB


